

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport celebrated the grand opening of its newest exhibit, "Transcendent: More to Haiti Than You Know", on Concourse E that featured 25 works by Haitian artists. The paintings represent the Haitian people, the country's landscape, and its natural beauty. The Airport's Director of International Business, Alrene Barr, provided remarks on Hartsfield-Jackson's support for the exhibition. Greg Richardson, the Airport's Chief Financial Officer, revealed that 300,000 people visit the facility daily - which provides an impressive audience for these artists. The event also brought remarks from Haitian diplomatic authorities, such as the Ambassador of Haiti to the US, Hervé Denis, the Consul General of Haiti in New York City, Gandy Thomas and Head of Mission for the Consulate of Haiti in Atlanta, Roudelyne Nogar Jean. 

2020 Atlanta Metro Export Challenge

February 2020

The City of Atlanta Mayor's Office of International Affairs proudly partnered with the Metro Atlanta Chamber for this year's Atlanta Metro Export Challenge (Atlanta MEC). Atlanta MEC is a regional grant program designed to challenge small- to medium-sized companies in Metro Atlanta to explore international expansion efforts.

Earlier this week, the Metro Atlanta Chamber announced the 12 grant recipients for the 2020 cohort, which included three City of Atlanta-based companies: Axion BioSystems, First Performance, and Futurus. Recipients receive a \$5,000 reimbursement grant which the company can spend on expenses related to increasing their sales internationally. In addition to the grant funds, recipients will have access to other resources throughout the year that will help the development of their company's global sales plan.

Development programs such as the Atlanta MEC are reflective of Atlanta's endeavors to bolster economic development on a global scale. The Mayor's Office of International Affairs Director Vanessa Ibarra says, "With 95% of the world's consumer and 80% of purchasing power located outside the United States, our companies must be prepared to succeed in today's global market. Companies that export grow 20% faster, pay 18% higher wages, and are



companies that rely solely on the domestic market. However, less than 5% of U.S. companies export, and more than half of those sell only to one market." Ms. Ibarra continues, "By partnering with the Metro Atlanta Chamber and the Metro Export Challenge Grant, we have been able to ensure that Atlanta based small and medium-size businesses have access to the right resources, tools, and mentorship to stay competitive locally and grow internationally."

The City of Atlanta continuously invests in specialized efforts to mitigate the gap between small businesses and foreign markets.

"Metro Atlanta's small and mediumsized businesses make up 97% of all
businesses in the region, but many are
under exporting. Through grants such as
Atlanta MEC and seminars like our office's
Passport to Exports series, businesses
have an opportunity to expand into new,
global markets through exposure to
resources and assistance", says Cesar
Vence, Deputy Director of the Mayor's
Office of International Affairs. "We're very
excited for the Atlanta-based companies
that were selected since they showcase
Atlanta's diversity and also the City's
strength in biomedical research, fintech,
and future technologies sectors."

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Women + Trade

As part of MOIA's trade promotion initiative and to celebrate women entrepreneurs, MOIA hosted "Women + Trade," a virtual panel highlighting women exporters based in Atlanta, their impact on the global economy, and how they are handling the COVID-19 crisis. The Women + Trade virtual conversation was moderated by Cesar Vence, MOIA's Deputy Director, who leads the initiative. In addition to the panel of exporters, Kimberly Reed, President and Chairman of the Export-Import Bank of the United States, provided remarks about credit insurance programs and initiatives implemented by the agency that support current and prospective exporters in their businesses. Representatives from the University of Georgia Small Business Development Center (SBDC), Invest Atlanta, and Metro Atlanta Chamber, were also in attendance to highlight their resources to support small businesses and exporters during the ongoing COVID-19 crisis.

The Women Export University is a capacity building program that equips entrepreneurs with the necessary tools and resources to become globally competitive and increase the participation of women-owned businesses in international trade. The Women Export University curriculum includes virtual workshops, one-on-one consultations, insights and training on export strategies, tools and resources to enter new markets, insights on how to build an export-friendly digital presence, and guidance on package flows and preparing export shipments.

The Women Export University is a partnership between MOIA and UPS that aims to increase the participation of women-owned business in exporting and create more opportunities for women entrepreneurs to achieve economic equality.

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
CITY LEADERSHIP & THE

COVID-19 RESPONSE

Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms joined global leaders to discuss the increasingly important role of city leadership.

Despite the cancellation of the 2020 Pritzker Forum on Global Cities due to the pandemic, Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms joined leaders from around the world to recognize the role of city leadership in addressing global challenges. Whether confronting climate change, migration, or a public health emergency, cities have demonstrated their potential to address challenges that transcend national boundaries.

Atlanta Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms discussed the role of cities in addressing global challenges. City leaders must rely on the diversity in their communities to create opportunity for all and bridge the inequities in society.



MOIA participated in a series of round table conversations with over 50 international affairs offices domestic and abroad to discuss the impact of COVID-19 and the growing role of city leadership.

City Diplomacy during COVID-19, on the Road to Recovery & The Great Reset

In partnership with the University of Southern California Center on Public Diplomacy, MOIA convened a series of round table discussions between the heads of international affairs offices from 10 cities across the United States to share experiences and practices in navigating the COVID-19 crisis. The overarching themes of each conversation included, pivoting day-to-day job functions to support City essential departments, supporting the international community locally, maintaining diplomatic relations to learn how to address the impact of COVID-19, and identifying potential providers of PPE equipment and other related materials.

International Economic Diplomacy "Global Recovery Through the Pandemic and Beyond"

MOIA hosted an engaging and insightful discussion with city representatives from Atlanta, Amsterdam, São Paulo, and Seoul on how each city is navigating their COVID-19 economic recovery and support efforts and discussed innovative ways to recover through the pandemic and beyond. The conversation included speakers Peter de Kruijk, Director, Amsterdam Trade & Innovate, Luiz Alvaro Salles Aguiar de Menezes, Secretary of International Affairs for the City of São Paulo, and Jae wook Jeong, Head of Invest, Seoul Center.

Leading the Fight: How Cities are Acting on Global Issues

MOIA Director, Vanessa Ibarra, was invited by the Pacific Council on International Policy to participate in a virtual conversation with Ambassador Nina Hachigian, Deputy Mayor for International Affairs, City of Los Angeles. Moderated by Anka Lee, Truman National Security Project Fellow, the speakers discussed the growing role of cities in subnational diplomacy and how local governments can prepare for the greatest challenges of the future through greater global engagement.

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France Atlanta Virtual Opening Ceremony

The Future of Atlanta's Global Workforce

In February, MOIA, in partnership with the Greater Atlanta Coalition for Global Education and Research (GAcGEAR) and Sage, launched its first event of the year designed to discuss the importance of global competence in an increasingly competitive workforce. The event, titled "The Future of Atlanta's Global Workforce", featured representatives and officials from Deloitte, Metro Atlanta Chamber, Sage, Volantio, UPS, and Georgia's top ranking universities. Due to advances in technology and globalization, the needs in the labor market have dramatically shifted in the past decade. Consequently, this has created uncertainties about what skills college graduates should prioritize to be marketable candidates in the workforce. Seeing this gap, MOIA, GAcGEAR, and Sage collaborated to host this intimate conversation with the intent to revisit what modern companies and corporations are seeking from ideal employable candidates, and what students need to learn to be adequately prepared to meet those demands.

The event concluded with a perfectly executed example on how to rectify the global skills gap. Two teams from Sage's Al Workshop at Banneker High School presented their app prototypes designed to address some of the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals, demonstrating how the skills they learn in the classroom will help to make themselves (and Atlanta) global.

In 2014, she founded in Brazil the "Iziane Institute" focused on youth, education, and sports.



Kristi Castlin

Kristi Castlin is an Atlanta native, 2016 Olympic Bronze Medalist, USA Track and Field athlete, and lifestyle influencer. Also known by her nickname, "Hollywood" has traveled to over 45 countries for competitions and philanthropy.
