



WOMEN EXPORT UNIVERSITY



The Women Export University is a partnership between MOIA and UPS that aims to increase women-owned business participation in exporting and create more opportunities for women entrepreneurs to achieve economic equality. The four-month curriculum includes insights and training on export strategies, tools, and resources to enter new markets, how to build an export-friendly digital presence, and guidance on package flows and preparing export shipments. The program operates at no cost to participants and includes one-on-one mentoring sessions and access to various federal, state, and local resources.






City of Atlanta receives La French Tech accreditation


DIPLOMACY HIGHLIGHTS




Vanessa's French **National Order of Merit**

MOIA Director, Vanessa Ibarra, received the prestigious French National Order of Merit (L'ordre national du Mérite) with the rank of Knight from President Emmanuel Macron for her many years of dedicated service in advancing the France-Atlanta relationship.

Vanessa is a proud Latina leading diplomatic affairs on behalf of the City of Atlanta, and is the first woman of Latin American descent in Atlanta to be knighted by the French government. Her extensive work in advancing the France – Atlanta relationship have brought significant contributions to the local French community and international partners over the years.

The French National Order of Merit is a presidential award that recognizes distinguished services or acts of devotion, bravery, generosity, and commitment to the service of others, in the military or the public and private sectors. It is ranked as the second-highest award in France after the Legion of Honour (Ordre national de la Légion d'honneur).


Atlanta's LGBTQ Affairs Director joins European conversation on the role of cities in promoting LGBTQ rights






Paulina Guzman joins Daegu to discuss international activities during the pandemic



Born in Montreal, Canada and an alumna of Whitfield Academy in Marietta, Georgia, Grand'Pierre is the first female Olympic Swimmer to represent the beautiful country of Haiti in the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Following the Olympics in 2018 at the CCCAN Games (Central American and Caribbean Swimming Championships), Grand'Pierre won the first Haitian medals for swimming: Gold and Silver medals in the 50m and 100m Breaststroke. To add to her impressive resume, Grand'Pierre is also the national record holder in the 50m & 100m Freestyle and 50m Fly.
